

Veer Volleyball Club Reasi wins 37th Reasi District Volleyball Championship

REASI: Veer Volleyball Club Reasi was crowned champion of the 37th Reasi District Volleyball Championship after defeating Viper's Volleyball Club Katra in a thrilling final by 3-0 sets (25-21, 25-17, 25-23) at the Sports Complex Katra.

The two-day championship, organised by the Volleyball Association of J&K in coordination with Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board (SMVDSB) under the aegis of the J&K Sports Council, witnessed participation from eight teams representing different areas of Reasi district, including Agghar Jitto, Bagdar, Panthal, Reasi, and Katra.

Alok Kumar Maurya, Additional CEO, SMVDSB Katra, was the Chief Guest at

the concluding function. He announced the Shrine Board's commitment to promoting sports infrastructure at Katra, including an indoor volleyball stadium and the appointment of a professional coach to engage youth in sports and steer them away from social evils such as drug abuse. JU organises seminar to mark International Women's Day

JAMMU: The Business School (TBS), University of Jammu (JU), organised a one-day seminar to celebrate International Women's Day 2026 under the theme "Give to Gain: Empowering Women, Enriching Society." The seminar highlighted the importance of investing in women's education, leadership and mentorship as a catalyst for sustainable development and social progress. The event featured a panel discussion with experts from diverse fields who shared their perspectives on advancing gender equality and strengthening women's roles in society.

Neeraj Gupta Bakshi, Director General, Local Funds Audit and Pensions, J&K, spoke about various government schemes aimed at women's empowerment. She encouraged women to be proactive and fearless in pursuing their aspirations, describing them as the "unsung heroes" of society.

Prof. Alka Sharma, Dean, Faculty of Business Studies and Director, SIEDC, University of Jammu, introduced the theme of the seminar. She described empowerment as an essential institutional framework rather than merely a social objective. She emphasized that many societies still fail to treat women as equals and stressed that men also play a

crucial role in supporting women's empowerment. She further highlighted the need to provide women with opportunities to pursue education and careers of their choice. Senior Advocate Meenakshi Slathia, partner at Slathia Law Firm, pointed out the gap between constitutional rights and social realities, stressing the importance of bridging this divide.

Dr. Saima Sadiq, Assistant Professor in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at Government Medical College Jammu, emphasized the importance of women's health. She highlighted the need for greater awareness regarding menstrual health and the HPV vaccine.

Journalist Asha Sarmal from Gulistan News and JK Media spoke about the role of governance and accounta-

bility in addressing issues such as literacy, crime and social justice to ensure meaningful empowerment for women.

Geetika Kohli, founder of the startup Thinksta, shared insights on how women's struggles are often overlooked and called for dismantling unequal systems while encouraging women to grow beyond imposed identi-

ties. Earlier, Prof. Amisha Gupta, Director of The Business School, delivered the welcome address and highlighted the transformational role of women as agents of change. She also emphasized the institution's role in mentoring women leaders who have excelled in business, academics and administration.

During the event, panelists

were formally felicitated by faculty members. The Creative Showcase team was also recognized for presenting a thematic skit written and directed by Rohan Sharma and Avinash Lakhotra.

The panel discussion was moderated by Dr. Anubid Hussain Parrey, Assistant Professor at TBS. The programme concluded with an interactive open house session that allowed students and scholars to engage directly with the panelists.

The formal vote of thanks was delivered by Prof. Komal Nagar, who expressed gratitude to the university administration, resource persons, scholars and students for making the event a success. She also noted a positive cultural shift, stating that the narrative has evolved from "women vs women" to a collective movement of "women for women."
